

“Taiwan Lectures on Chinese Studies” Invites Professor Hsueh-chi Hsu to Deliver a Lecture Online

NCL co-hosted the fifth online “Taiwan Lectures on Chinese Studies” Series with the University of Washington on March 2. The lecture was presented by Prof. Hsueh-chi Hsu, entitled “The Current Status and Development of the Studies of Taiwan History”.

Prof. Hsueh-chi Hsu is the Distinguished Research Fellow and the Director of the Institute of Taiwan History, Academia Sinica, Taiwan. She specializes in Taiwan history (Qing, Japanese, and post-war periods), family history, institution history, and oral history.

In this speech, Prof. Hsu discussed the trends and changes in the study of Taiwan history, the role of the Institute of Taiwan History of Academia Sinica, the development of local gazetteers, village history, and local studies in Taiwan, and the study of Taiwan’s indigenous people. She also mentioned some useful print and electronic resources for the Studies of Taiwan History.
